Introduction

- <u>Purpose:</u> To explore safety net program and employment service activity participation for persons with disabilities
- Sponsor: Employment Policy and Measurement Rehabilitation Research and Training Center at University of New Hampshire
- <u>Funding</u>: National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR)
- <u>Data</u>: 2009 Current Population Survey Annual Social and Economic Supplement (CPS-ASEC)

Research Questions

- 1) Program composition: What share of safety net program participants of working age are persons with disabilities?
- 2) Participation differences: Do working age persons with disabilities participate in safety net programs at different rates than working age persons who do not have disabilities?
- 3) Employment service differences: Do working age persons with disabilities who are participating in safety net programs participate in employment services at different rates than working age persons who do not have disabilities?




Percent participating in safety net programs, persons age 25-61, 2009



Research Questions

- 3) Employment service differences: Do working age persons with disabilities who are participating in safety net programs participate in employment services at different rates than working age persons who do not have disabilities?

Summary

- 1) About one-third of safety net program participants are persons with disabilities.
- 2) Persons with disabilities participate in safety net programs at higher rates than persons without disabilities.
- 3) Rates of participation in employment services are low for low income, not employed, program participants with and without disabilities.
